

Student Behavior Management Policy

Academic Year 2025/2026

- Students are required to comply with the policies of the Department of Education and Knowledge as well as the policies of United International Private School for the academic year 2025/2026.
- In case a student commits any violation, the school will take the following actions according to the type and degree of the violation.

- First-Degree Violations

Violation	Action Taken
Being late to morning assembly or not participating without an acceptable excuse.	Verbal warning + documentation (first time).
Repeated lateness to classes (on-campus or online) without a valid excuse.	Written warning + notify parents (first repeat).
Failure to wear the school or sports uniform.	Deduct 2 marks + parent meeting + signed pledge (second repeat).
Unacceptable hairstyles or long hair for boys.	Deduct 4 marks + parent meeting + social worker review (third repeat).
Not bringing textbooks or school supplies.	Deduction decided by committee + case study + behavioral correction plan (more than 3 times).

- Second-Degree Violations

Violation	Action Taken
Absence before/after holidays, weekends, or exams without excuse.	Deduct 4 marks + written pledge + parent meeting (first time).
Skipping classes during the school day (including online learning).	Deduct 8 marks + suspension up to 2 days + second warning (first repeat).
Entering or leaving class without permission.	Deduct 8 marks + suspension 1–3 days + final warning + possible transfer (second repeat).

- **Third-Degree Violations (Serious)**

Violation	Action Taken
Bullying of all types.	Deduct 12 marks + Behavior Committee review + suspension + referral to authorities (first time).
Plagiarism (copying homework/reports/projects).	Deduct 12 marks + referral + transfer to another scho (first repeat).
Leaving or escaping school without permission.	Same as above.

- **Fourth-Degree Violations (Severe & Critical)**

Violation	Action Taken
Misuse of communication/social media for illegal/immoral purposes or to defame the school/staff/others.	Immediate suspension + referral to authorities + Behavior Committee decision (expulsion/behavior subject failure).
Possession or use of weapons (firearms, knives, etc.).	Same as above.
Sexual assault on campus, bus, or during activities.	Same as above.
Drug possession, use, or distribution.	Same as above.

Behavior Marking System

- Total Behavior Marks: 100
- Positive Behavior: 80 (core grade, can increase/decrease).
- Distinguished Behavior: +20 (personal growth, respect for Islamic values, UAE culture & world cultures, social responsibility, leadership & innovation).
- Marks are deducted when students commit violations as listed above.
